The word qur'ān appears about 70 times in the Quran itself, assuming various meanings. It is a verbal noun of the Arabic verb qara'a (قرأ), meaning "he read" or "he recited". The Syriac equivalent is (ܩܪܝܢܐ) qeryānā, which refers to "scripture reading" or "lesson". While some Western scholars consider the word to be derived from the Syriac, the majority of Muslim authorities hold ...
